Alexander Turnbull Library. *Alexander Turnbull Library Biographies Index, Rārangi Haurongo*. 1995. Entries index biographical information about people in a wide range of published and some manuscript sources. Some sources indexed are held only in the Alexander Turnbull Library.

Bell, L. *Colonial constructs: European images of Māori 1840-1914*. 1992. Includes several named portraits.

Ellis, E. M. *The gift of tongues: Interpreters named in the New Zealand Gazette, 1853-1953: An index*. 1994. Many Māori interpreters listed; original entries in the Gazette may have further details.

Evison, H. C. *Te Wai Pounamu: The greenstone island, a history of the southern Maori during the European colonization of New Zealand*. 1993. A history of the Southern Māori during the European colonisation of NZ. Ngati Huirapa, Ngati Irakehu, Ngati Kuri, Ngati Moki, Ngati Mako, Ngati Mamoe, Ngati Rangiamoa, Ngai Tahu, Ngai Tarewa, Ngai Te Kahukura, Ngai Te Ruahikihiki, Ngai Tuhaitara, Ngati Waewae, Ngati Wairangi and Waitaha are some of the South Island Iwi/Hapu mentioned in the text.

Fildes, H. E. M. *Selective indexes to certain books relating to early New Zealand*. 1984. Chapter 2 is specifically relative to Māori Whakapapa.

Fletcher, J. *Index of Māori names*. 2004. An index drawn from standard printed works such as the Journal of the Polynesian Society, to personal, place, and iwi names. 2 reels of microfilm.

Macdonald, C., Penfold, M., & Williams, B. R. *The book of New Zealand women: Ko kuia ma te kaupapa*. 1991. Many biographies of Māori women, e.g. Ana Hata of Te Arawa descent; Airini Nga Roimata Grenell of Ngai Tahu descent.

Mapihi kahurangi: Prized treasures: Illustrated biographies from Ngā taangata taumata rau. 1993. Biographies first published in the Dictionary of National Biography, translated into te reo.

McKinnon, M., Bradley, B., Kirkpatrick, R. *Bateman New Zealand historical atlas = Ko papatuanuku e takoto nei*. 1997. Whakapapa is displayed prominently from Kupe down to the hapu of those districts. Māori place names, main marae, landing places, mountains and their stories, brief notes of legends, as well as whakatauki. Iwi maps are displayed three-dimensionally and are divided into waka areas.

Ngā tāngata taumata rau, 1990-. Essays on Māori first published in the Dictionary of National Biography, translated into te reo.
