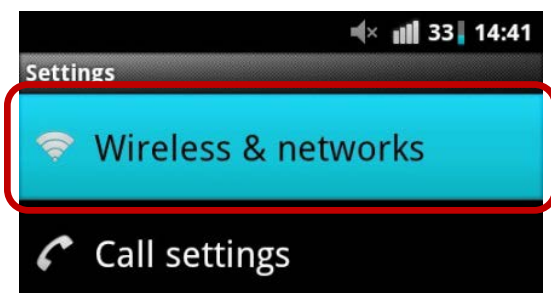
Connecting to the UoA-WiFi network – Android

Note: This guide is for use with wireless-enabled Android devices, using their in-built wireless configuration service only.

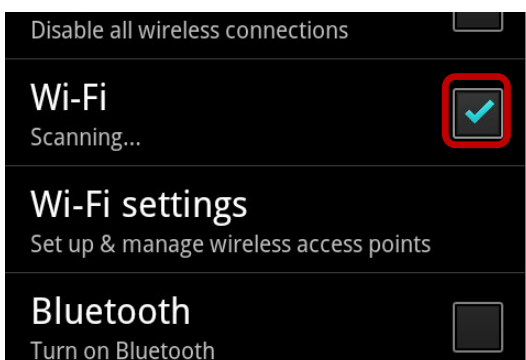
In your home menu, select **Settings**:



In "Settings", select **Wireless & networks**:



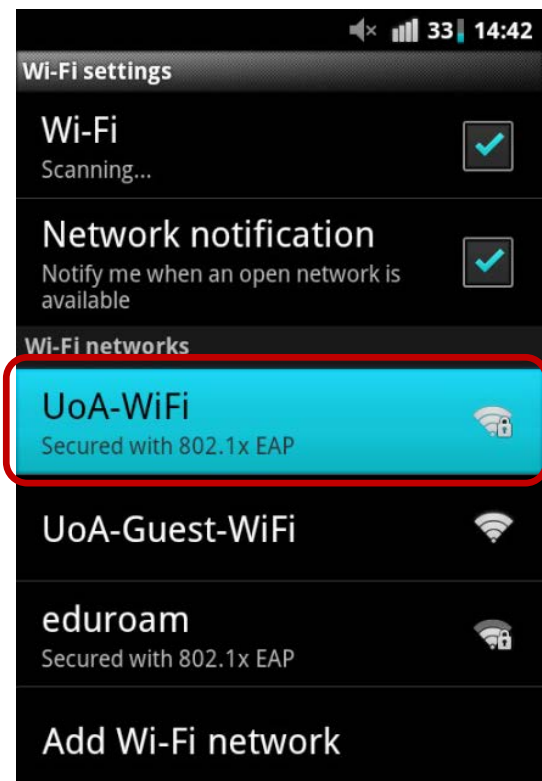
Your Wi-Fi is enabled if there is a tick-mark in the **Wi-Fi** box:



If there is no tick-mark, select **Wi-Fi** then, select **Wi-Fi settings**:



When your Wi-Fi is enabled, a list of available networks will display. Select **UoA-WiFi**:



If prompted to enter a password, use your University username and password.

If you don't get a password prompt, the "UoA-WiFi" security settings screen will pop-up. Configure your security settings as follows then, select **Connect**:



Browsing the internet

When your device has connected to the UoA-WiFi network, you should be able to browse the internet.

Troubleshooting

If your device doesn't automatically install the CA certificate for this connection, it will need to be manually installed as follows:

Ensure that your Wi-Fi is turned on. From your applications menu, navigate through Settings > Wireless & networks > Wi-Fi settings. A list of available networks should appear. Choose the **UoA-Guest-WiFi** network then, select **Connect**:



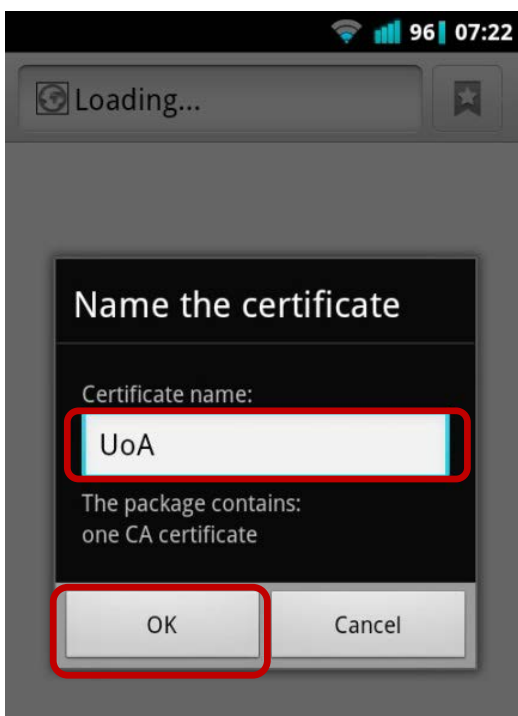
Open your internet browser and enter your University "username" and "Password" then, select **Sign In**:



After your browser loads, enter the following URL in the address bar: <http://www.auckland.ac.nz/wireless>
After the web page has loaded, scroll down and select **QuoVadis root certificate**:



When prompted, name the certificate **UoA** then, select **OK**:



Now, go back to the beginning and repeat the above instructions by selecting **Settings** in your home menu.

However, this time, when you configure the security settings, for the CA certificate, use **UoA**:
