


Finding course readings in Canvas

From Canvas

- Go into a specific course. Readings can appear under '**Reading Lists**' or '**Modules**'.



Note: some courses may not use online course reading lists.

Reading list features

The screenshot below highlights some key features of a reading list. The overall structure and layout of the list will depend on the lecturer (eg, by week, module, topic etc).

Better to use Referencite or a referencing guide

View list sections at a glance and go directly to a specific section on the list.

Click on **title** to display further information for citation purposes or to access the resource.

Look for the **Online Resource** button – click to directly access electronic resources.

Readings include an importance label (eg, essential, further, textbook) and notes for students.

Adding notes and reading intentions

You can add your own notes and reading intentions to individual items on the reading list. This helps you organise and keep track of your readings. Notes are private to you.

To add notes and reading intentions, you will first need to create a profile. You only need to do this once:

1. From Course Reading Lists, **Log in** with your University username and password
2. Click on **Create a profile**
3. Follow the instructions and fill in the required fields
